- According to USDA (2000), the Mexican states that share a border with United States generally have the lowest poverty rates compared to the rural states in Mexico. At the U.S. border, the poverty rate in Mexico ranges from a low of 21 percent in Baja California to a high of 42 percent in Tamaulipas.

## U.S. Counties in the U.S./Mexico Border Region

There are 26 counties that share their borders with Mexico. Additionally, there are 24 counties that do not share their borders with Mexico but lie within the border region which is defined as the geographical area that extends 62 miles on either side of the U.S./Mexico border. The list of counties in the border region is derived from HRSA website. (<http://bphc.hrsa.gov/bphc/borderhealth/>) However, HRSA lists only 48 counties within the border region. It does not list two counties that directly share their borders with Mexico (Lea and Eddy counties in New Mexico).
